11TH ANNUAL YOUTH ART EXHIBITION KICKS OFF THE NEW YEAR AT PHILLIPS' MILL Phillips' Mill Community Association is proud to feature the annual Youth Art Exhibition showcasing dynamic artwork from local high school students. Now in its 11th year, the exhibition opens at the historic Mill on January 28 and runs on weekends through February 18. The show will also be available online.

Working in collaboration with school art teachers who curate the artwork submitted, the show features paintings, works on paper, photography, digital art and three-dimensional work. There are 23 schools participating this year.

The Youth Art Exhibition gives these young artists a taste of what it's like to be a professional artist. "We display the students' art the same way we display the prestigious Phillips' Mill Juried Art Show, so it is very professionally done," explains Kathy Schroeder, founder and co-chair of the show. "It's great for the students to see their work in a beautiful space and professional gallery. It's different from having it shown at your high school art show. They get the chance to reach a much broader audience, and they can see what the other kids are doing."
